# What is it?

- A web site
- <http://greenfootgallery.org/>
- A showcase for scenarios developed by users of the Greenfoot environment
- A resource for getting help with Greenfoot

# How it Works

- Users upload their scenarios to the gallery (after creating an account)
- Other users can indicate that they like the scenario (“vote” for the scenario)
- They can also leave feedback in the form of comments on the scenario
- Scenario index allows searching for best rated, most viewed, recently updated (etc) scenarios

# Benefits

- Allows users to show their creative skills, without having to have their own web server
- Community feedback increases motivation to improve scenarios, develop new scenarios
- Gallery users help each other with programming problems
- Shows off a range of scenarios to the public, generates interest in Greenfoot

# Uploading to the Gallery

- ... is very easy and can be done from within Greenfoot!
- “Scenario” -> “Export...”
- “Publish” tab. Fill in a few details, username and password, then
- “Export”
- That’s it!

# Collections

- A recent addition to the gallery
- Users can create collections, and invite scenarios into the collection
- Scenario owners can accept (or decline) invitations
- When invitation accepted, scenario appears in the collection when the collection is viewed

# Collections (cont'd)

- Provide a way for non-programmers to have “ownership” of content on the gallery
- Increased motivation and challenge: to get into a collection, must meet owner’s required standards
- Provide an easy way to show scenarios of a particular class, run a competition, group scenarios by topic, etc
